How to choose your Spa?

What should your primary objective be?

You must already accept that your spa will be used by you and your spouse, and therefore

by just the two of you in 85% of the time, if not more.

That's why it's essential to be selfish in your choice. You'll be happier if your spa is 100% yours, just like your bedding or your car.



The number of places in a spa in no way determines the number of people who can sit in it. It does determine the number of massage locations possible. The type of seat is the first determining factor.



Does my size matter in my choice?

It's up to you to decide, according to your tastes, how many places you'd prefer to lie down with jets to massage the top of the shoulders (trapezius). These are the details that will help you make the right choice. You need to think of yourself first and only! Indoor or outdoor installation? An indoor installation may limit the choice of spa model because of its size, and the size of the openings into the room.

You need to take your height into account to ensure the best possible comfort. Designed with ergonomics ideal for Europeans, our spas will not all offer the same level of comfort, depending on the model chosen, for someone who is 1.95 metres tall and someone who is 1.5 metres tall.

Does the number of jets determine the quality of a spa?

Don't be seduced by the number of jets when making your choice. The number of jets is only of interest if the pumps are of sufficient capacity and calculated accordingly. You also need to distinguish between the number of air jets and the number of water jets.



Is jet technology an important factor in my choice?

Yes, jet technology is important! You absolutely must have either 100% stainless steel and ABS jets or ABS only jets. Never use chrome jets, which deteriorate quickly. There must also be a venturi system on the circuits, which will give variations in speed and therefore dynamics to your massages. You need jets of different types and diameters. The flow rate of the jets must be adjustable from 0 to 100%, and the direction of the directional jets must also be adjustable.



Is a bigger spa better than a smaller one?

A good spa remains a good spa, whatever its size. However, it's obvious that if you can install a larger spa in your home, it will offer greater comfort because there's more room to move around. A spa measuring 2 metres or less will have 3 pumps, whereas one larger than that will have 4 pumps and therefore more adjustment options thanks to its 3 massage pumps.

Which options should I choose?

There are a number of options available on a spa. To personalise your spa, you can select options according to your preferences and desires.

• The blower :

This is a motor that draws in heated air from inside the SPA and sends it to the jets provided. The purpose of sending air into the spa is multiple. It serves to revive the fragrance molecules you may have put in your water, it provides the bubble bath effect, aromatherapy if you have taken this option, and it grips the muscles during massages to invigorate the legs and thighs.

• The light cascade :

Add a zen feel to your wellness sessions and liven up your spa with its lighting effects.



• waterline leds :

They go around the spa 1 to 2 cm above the water line, giving an impressive lighting effect.

• Illuminated corner units :

Inlaid in the corners of the spa, they create a halo of light towards the floor and gently illuminate the bottom of the spa.

• The MP3 option



You can install an amplifier for an MP3 player or one of your mobile phones. An access hatch, with a non-slip support, accommodates your device, to which you connect the mini jack plug. A switch turns the amp on. With this option, you have 2 Pop-Up speakers backlit by LEDs and which can be retracted at will.

• Speakers :

Supplied with the MP3 option, they are backlit by LEDs and contribute to the luminous ambience of your spa. They give an enveloping effect and offer quality sound.

• The Subwoofer:

It's an amp with a bass option and 2 additional Pop Up speakers. The result is a deeper, fuller sound.
