Installing a spa at home is a good idea for improving your comfort, but it's also a project that needs to be prepared for in advance.

## Installing a spa: the basic rules

There are a number of rules you need to know to install a spa in your own home safely. Here are 5 essential points to remember:

- Your spa must be placed on a flat, stable surface. Subsidence could damage your spa and render it unusable.
- Provide water and electricity supplies close to your equipment.
- Don't forget to provide drainage for water renewal and maintenance.
- Make sure the ground around the spa is water-resistant and non-slip. If you want an indoor, the floor must also be watertight and the room well ventilated.
- Position your spa so that all the technical components are easily accessible. This can be useful in the event of a breakdown.



## Where to install your spa?

Choosing the right location for your spa is essential. You have two options: installing your spa outdoors or indoors.

### AN OUTDOOR SPA

If you want your spa area to be in harmony with nature and energising, opt for the outdoors. Installing an outdoor spa is generally simpler than installing one indoors. Choose a location with a pleasant view and sheltered from the wind if possible.



### AN INDOOR SPA

If you prefer a "cocooning", relaxing spa area, an indoor spa will enable you to create the ideal atmosphere. However, the technical constraints are greater and you need to make sure that the floor on which you are going to place your spa can bear the weight.



You need to take into account the weight of the empty spa, on average 300 to 600kg, and add the weight of the water and the occupants. You won't have any problems with the weather, and if you opt for a bright room like a veranda, you'll also be able to enjoy the view outside and sunny days..
